

Bhavan's Lloyds Vidya Niketan is an English Medium Co-educational School affiliated to CBSE, Delhi. The school was started in 1995. The school is run and managed by Bharatiya Vidya Bhavan, Mumbai. It has classes from Nursery to XII in a building situated on 10 acres of land. A perfect blend of education, ethnicity and extracurricular activities is what we aim at. Besides the regular teaching a fusion of sports, music, outdoor games, indoor games, art work, values etc. enables your child to blossom into a perfect example of responsiveness, stability and sensitivity. #### Comprehensive Evaluation Report

A good school is said to be one which not only judges a child's academic performance but seeks the all-round development of a child. BLVN keeps a vigilance over child's various activities academic as well as non-academic. Also, the behaviour of a student under various circumstances is observed and a profile is prepared based on the observations. This profile is prepared quarterly and sent to the parents to keep them informed about their child's progress, development and areas needing attention.

#### Games and Sports

Physical Education is an integral part of the school education. The school has spacious play ground with an athletic track of 200 meters. Physical training is compulsory for all the students who are required to participate in various track & field events. Foot-ball, cricket, basket-ball, hand-ball, volley ball, throw-ball, dodge-ball, table tennis, badminton and khokho are played by the students under the supervision and guidance of teachers. Indoor games include carrom, chess, table-tennis and badminton. Special training in Yoga is also imparted by Physical education teacher.

#### NCC and Scouts & Guides

In order to forge a character through the steel of discipline we have NCC.

#### · Activities:

The school has hobby clubs where students are taught - Dance (classical), Music (instrumental), Music (vocal) and Art & Craft Work.

#### House System

The school has four houses: 1. Aravali 2. Himalaya 3. Sahyadri 4. Shivalik

All the students are organized in these four houses. Each house on rotation supervises,
controls and manages the school activities for a week. THE HOUSE ON DUTY looks after the
school for a week. Inter House competitions are organized to develop the qualities of
leadership, self-confidence, loyalty, team spirit, co-operation and art of speaking. Each house
has a specific colour, its motto and a song.

#### Co-operative Learning:

Group Dynamics, Unique dimension of teaching and learning process is learning in groups. Each subject teacher conducts a group activity based on the text and grades are given which is reflected in the continuous assessment. The objective of group activity is to instil co-operative learning, develop qualities and create a cheerful and relaxing atmosphere for learning with an air of informality.

#### Parent-Teacher Meetings:

P.T.M. is conducted every 3rd Saturday. Every parent is free to visit school on this day and meet and interact freely with the teacher concerned regarding his/her ward/s, on other days Parent should take prior appointment to meet the Teachers.

#### Educational Tours / Excursion:

The school organizes educational tours / excursion from time to time. The students are taken to places of Educational, Historical and Religious importance. The programme enhances knowledge, enriches experience of the students, relieves them from daily routine and provides an opportunity to encounter real life situation with all its beauty, rhythm and spontaneity.

#### Value Education:

Value Education is an integral part of education system. In BLVN, for inculcating moral values and making students aware of the need of moral values, workshops on Value Education & Life Skills for junior and senior students are conducted. Values cannot be 'taught', they have to be 'caught' therefore during the workshop, emphasis on values through story, play, group discussion, enactment, visit to old age home, orphanage home, collecting fund for Charity, etc is given.

#### Admission:

Admissions begin in the month of January for Nursery Students. In other classes students are admitted, subjected to availability of seats.

Admission from Class Nursery to VIII is open for all, however children/wards of Uttam Value Group employees are given preference. Prospectus is issued from the office of the school between 10.00 a.m. to 1.00 p.m. in the month of March every year.

- Age: For Admission in Nursery, Child should complete 3 years on 31st December.

Photo copy of the progress card of the school last attended. 4. Two latest passport size photographs. 5. Photo copy of Aadhar card 6. Caste Certificate, if belongs to category.

All students are required to submit the following certificates/documents of the last

examination passed.

#### RULES FOR PRE-PRIMARY SECTION

- Students are instructed to address their teachers and all members of staff, teaching and non-teaching with due respect and politeness.
- Students should be punctual to school. Late arrival will not be acceptable. They are required to reach the school premises 10 minutes before the first bell.
- The child should be brought to the school in time. If the child reaches the school earlier, parents should not leave the school premises until the teacher takes charge.
- The school authorities should be informed about the identity of the person who will be bringing and taking the child from school every day.
- 5. The parents are not allowed to enter the classroom during school hours.
- Parents should not send any valuable items with their children to the school. The school authorities will not be responsible for the loss of the same or for any harm caused to the children because of the same.
- 7. An extra set of clothes along with under clothes should be kept in the school throughout the year. (If the clothes are soiled and taken home, they should be replaced on the next day without fail).
- 8. We enjoy celebrating children's birthday in school, but we request parents to co-operate with the school authorities. Children can come in their party dress to class. The class can celebrate the child's birthday by wishing him/her and making a card for the child. Parents must avoid giving sweets/toys/party favours to the children individually.
- Parents are expected to read the notices from time to time regarding holidays & other activities of the school.
- 10.Parent-teacher meetings are held to keep the parents updated with their child's development at school. Hence it is advised that both the parents attend all parent teacher meetings as arranged at the school from time to time.

#### RULES FOR PRIMARY TO SENIOR SECTION

- Students are instructed to address their teachers and all members of staff, teaching and nonteaching with due respect and politeness. In case of any difficulty, students are expected to approach their teachers with trust and let them know their problems whatever they may be.
- Students should be punctual to school. Late arrival will not be acceptable. They are required to reach the school premises 10 minutes before the first bell.
- Students are permitted to make calls to parents/guardians only under emergency. Frequent telephone calls from parents are discouraged.
- Students must take sufficient care of their personal appearance. Students should come to school
  in neat & tidy uniform. Personal hygiene and cleanliness are expected from all students.
- Habitual late attendance, repeated unjustified absence, habitual inattention to school work, disobedience, unbecoming language or objectionable moral conduct or habitual breaking of school rules are sufficient enough for the termination of a student.
- Every student should endeavour to keep the fair name and image of the school by exhibiting good manners.
- 7. Much emphasis is given to the maintenance of discipline in the school. The rules of conduct and the code of honour of the school are based on instilling a sense of discipline in the students without infringing upon their natural traits. The effort is to channelise their talents and energy into useful pursuits and to make them disciplined in thought and action.
- No extraneous books, periodicals or newspapers, CD's etc. of an objectionable nature shall be brought into the school. All books for private reading (except those borrowed from the school library) are prohibited.
- Every pupil attending school is obliged to take part in the choral singing, drill, games and all other school activities. When required to represent the school outside in an activity, participation will be deemed compulsory.
- Students should not bring costly articles & electronic gadgets to school, if found, would be confiscated.
- 11. If a child is found damaging school property, parents will pay for the damages incurred by the school at actuals.
- IMPORTANT NOTE FOR ADMISSION TO CLASS XI

#### A FOR STUDENTS:

- Please read the Prospectus carefully.
- Special care should be taken to fill in the application form for admission accurately and completely. If false or wrong information is given the admission stands cancelled.
- Attention of students is invited especially to the rules regarding attendance and discipline. Ignorance of these rules will not be a valid excuse.

#### **B** FOR PARENTS/ GUARDIANS:

- Please read the Prospectus to acquaint yourselves with the rules regarding attendance & discipline to be observed strictly by your ward (if admitted).
- You are encouraged to come to the school during the year to enquire about the attendance and progress of your ward.

#### C PROCEDURE FOR ADMISSION: (FOR STD XI)

 The school admits students only subjected to the availability of vacancy and fitness of the students for the stream to which admission is sought and without any other distinction.

- 2. All candidates must submit their duly filled application form within five days after the declaration of the Board results. They must submit at least a true copy of the mark list if other documents are not available at the time of registration
- 3. Admission will not be given on a duplicate Transfer Certificate.
- 4. A student applying for admission to any class of this school should get himself/herself satisfied whether he/she is eligible for admission to the school. If the Board does not accept him/her as eligible for admission. The school will not accept any responsibility for his/her admission.

#### D. RULES FOR CHANGE IN SUBJECT: (Rule 26 of CBSE)

- Change of subject(s) in class XI may be allowed (depending on the availability of seats) by the Head of the school but not later than 31st of October of the academic session.
- 2. No candidate shall be permitted to change his subject of study after passing class XI.
- 3. The candidate shall not offer a subject in class XII which he has not studied and passed in Class XI.

#### E. SOME IMPORTANT RULES OF THE SCHOOL:

- 1. For promotion to Std. XII: (Compulsory Factors)
  - i) Attendance: To become eligible to appear for the annual examination, a student must have 80% attendance to his credit.
  - ii) In Std. XI only those who secure 50% marks in each subject (separately in Theory and Practical(s) and maintain the aggregate will be promoted to Std. XII.
- 2. In Std. XII only those students who secure 50% marks in each subject (separately in Theory and Practical(s) and maintain the aggregate of 50% in the half yearly and preliminary exam would be allowed to appear for the board examination.
- RULES REGARDING WITHDRAWAL/ LATE ADMISSION: 1. The parents are required to give at least one calendar months' notice before withdrawing a student from the school.
- 2.The term fee for the term in which withdrawal is intended is payable in any event. In case of failure to give sufficient and proper notice, the parents may become liable to pay term fee for the next term as well.

#### Examples:

- If a withdrawal takes place in the month of October and one calendar month notice is not received by the school, 2nd term fees will be charged.
- Tuition fees will be obviously payable for entire notice period, whether such notice is given or not.
- Failure to pay any amount due under the rules, shall result in the dues being recovered from the amount of caution money deposit.
- Admission fee are not refundable under any circumstances. All withdrawal applications should be submitted in prescribed form which can be collected from the school office. Applications will not be valid if not submitted in the prescribed form.
- Term fee will be charged from the date of commencement of the term in respect of late admission. If a student is admitted during second term, only 2nd term fee will be charged. However, tuition fees shall be payable from the beginning of the month in which admission is secured.
- Failure to remit the fees on the specified dates will result in the ward's name being struck
  off rolls.
